ISH MODULAR COURSES

The year 2025 has been a remarkable year in terms of Pakistan Hypertension League (PHL) academic activities. The Council, Patron and Academic Leads were keen to increase the outreach and inclusivity of the academic courses conducted by the PHL, while emphasizing on quality and the latest information on hypertension management.

In this regard, the PHL's signature International Society of Hypertension (ISH) modular course was first re-accredited by the ISH. It was then decided that the PHL would endeavor to conduct one course in each province of Pakistan.

The alternative European Society of Hypertension (ESH) modular course, which is a shorter course, was also offered to the Chapter Coordinators of relatively smaller cities, to increase access to quality education, while catering for logistic constraints.

The first course was initiated by President Prof. Kashif Hashmi in Multan, in January 2025. Each course is unique in that there are pretests and posttests, as well as a final exit exam at the end of the course. Successful participants must fulfill the criteria of acceptable attendance and passing the final exam. The course in Multan was concluded in May 2025 with a grand certificate distribution ceremony.

The second course was initiated in Karachi, by Vice-President Dr. Syedah Saira Bokhari, in April 2025, which concluded in July 2025. This course catered to Internal Medicine residents, general practitioners and cardiologists. The course was conducted in the PHL Secretariat in Karachi and was taught by many luminaries of Cardiology, thus continuing the legacy of the PHL/ISH course in Karachi.

After the successful launch of the courses in Multan and Karachi, the need to spread the course to other parts of the country was strongly felt. Many Chapter Coordinators and Council Members were keen to conduct the course in their city.

Joint Secretary of PHL Dr. Mashoog Dasti was the next visionary to conduct this course in Sehwan Sharif. The PHL is particularly proud of this effort, as it matches the vision of the PHL to be inclusive of all regions of Pakistan and not remain an organization that only caters to larger cities.

The course was initiated in May and successfully completed in July 2025. It was well attended by prominent general practitioners of the region, with participants hailing from over 100 km away and including doctors from Mehar, Johi, Dadu, Bhan Saeedabad and Naushero Feroz. The final certificate ceremony was well attended by many senior luminaries of Cardiology.

Dr. Huma Tareen (former Joint Secretary and Chapter Coordinator, Quetta) was the next to conduct the ESH course in Quetta. The course was initiated in June and concluded in July.

This course was well attended by many general physicians and other doctors from Quetta and neighboring regions. The efforts of the PHL were greatly lauded and the organizers were requested to continue such activities in the future as well.

It is worth noting that this the second consecutive year that the ESH course has been conducted in Quetta, highlighting the efforts of the Quetta Chapter and Coordinator and their continued willingness to carry on the message of quality education in Baluchistan.

The next ISH/PHL course was the well conducted and well attended course in Hyderabad. This was spearheaded by Prof. Shoukat Memon, under the patronage of Prof. Feroz Memon. This Course concluded in July 2025 and was also saw a gathering of many stars and stalwarts of Sindh, PHL and Cardiology.

It would be amiss to not mention the efforts of our industry sponsors Atco Pharmaceuticals and Getz Pharmaceuticals, who labored to arrange and coordinate the many courses that were conducted during this period. It is also worth mentioning that there are requests and plans to conduct the Course in Peshawar, Nawabshah and Tando Allah Yar. We hope that the message of quality education for all, a pillar of the ideals on which PHL was built, will continue in successive years.

Our participants lauded the efforts of the organizers and gave some very important feedback including requests to engage them in further courses, conduct refresher courses during the year and to spread the course to other regions. Some faculty members who were speakers during the course, wished to conduct it in their cities as well.

We are proud of that the message of quality education and correct understanding, and management of this important public health concern has gained such prominence.

Hypertension Facebook Live 29/05/25

The panel included distinguished cardiologists, pulmonologist, neurologist, nephrologist, internists, nursing, dietitian and physical rehabilitation experts. They answered many questions from the audience especially relevant to their specialties. This panel discussion was highly appreciated by the audience.

This was followed by a public screening camp where weight, height, blood pressure, pulse, random sugar and random cholesterol were checked and a cardiologist (Dr. S. Saira Bokahri) and internist (prof, Aysha Almas) were on hand to assess patients and discuss their findings and queries along with appropriate referral.





Prof Khalida Soomro has ample knowledge and experience in the field of Clinical, Non-Invasive and Invasive Cardiology since last 42 yrs, Has worked in various teach-ing positions in this field from 1984 and joined as profes-sor and chairperson of cardiology department of Dow university Karachi in 2004, she is author of more the 50 articlespublished in the various journal of Pakistan and remained on editorial board of main official medical journal of Pakistan. She has participated in many interna-tional studies e.g INTER HEART STUDY, GIK study Interpide study as local coordinator/researcher and in many international conferences as speaker globally, she is the first lady cardiologist of Pakistan, First lady president of Pakistan cardiac society. Treasurer Pakistan hypertension league and remained as vice president of Asia Pacific society Zone 3 of cardiology and current chair-person of scientific council of women with heart diseases of Pakistan cardiac society. President Sindh graduate association women branch and coordinator of GO RED PROGRAM of Women by American heart association in Pakistan. In recognition of her social medical services rendered in health sector of Pakistan she has been honoured with pride of performance award from governor Sindh in 2002 and TAMGAH-E-IMTIAZ National award by President of Pakistan in 2017.

Message

Tackling hypertension in women and its related mortality in Pakistan requires a more holistic approach, considering the country's unique healthcare and socio-cultural challenges. Here's a simple way to think about handling it:

First, raising awareness is crucial. Many women, particularly in rural areas, aren't aware of the risks and symptoms of hypertension. Education campaigns that focus on the dangers of high blood pressure and the importance of regular check-ups and Screening are the key could make a big difference. There should be more focus on encouraging women, especially in rural areas, to get their blood pressure checked regularly. Access to affordable health-care and medication is also a challenge. It's important to address cultural and societal barriers. In many areas, women may be reluctant to seek medical help due to family or societal pressures. Awareness and empower-ment programs like GO RED for Women that encourage women to take control of their health could help break these barriers. Additionally, involving local leaders and health-care professionals in these communities could change attitudes toward women's health. A well coordinated national effort, with government, NGOs, and the private sector working together, can have a meaningful impact on reducing hypertension in women and its associated risks in Pakistan.



Executive Summary

The Department of Cardiology at Shaikh Zayed Hospital, Lahore, established as part of the Shaikh Zayed Medical Complex commissioned in 1986, has been a leader in cardiovascular care, education, and community outreach in Pakistan. As a state-of-the-art Interventional cardiology unit equipped with two catheterization labs, the department offers advanced diagnostic and therapeutic services while prioritizing academic and public health initiatives. Since 2004, the department has conducted ongoing awareness campaigns focused on cardiovascular health, emphasizing prevention, early detection, and management of heart-related conditions. Key annual highlights include celebrations of World Hypertension Day (May 17) and World Heart Day (September 29), which have evolved into comprehensive programs involving workshops, screenings, and community engagement. This report outlines these activities, with a special focus on recent efforts, demonstrating the department's commitment to academic excellence and public health impact.

Historical Overview of Awareness Campaigns (2004 - Present)

Since 2004, the Department of Cardiology has spearheaded awareness campaigns to combat the rising prevalence of cardiovascular diseases in Pakistan, where heart conditions remain a leading cause of morbidity and mortality. These initiatives align with global efforts by organizations such as the World Heart Federation and the World Hypertension League, adapting international guidelines to local contexts.

Key milestones include:

Early Years (2004 - 2010):

Launch of foundational campaigns involving public seminars, free screening camps, and collaborations with the Pakistan Hypertension League (PHL). These efforts focused on educating the public about risk factors like hypertension, smoking, and unhealthy diets. For instance, in partnership with PHL's Lahore Chapter, the department organized awareness sessions and blood pressure monitoring drives.

2011 Onwards:

Expansion to include targeted events on international observance days. A notable example from 2011 was an awareness camp at Shaikh Zayed Hospital on World Hypertension Day, featuring BP monitoring, screening for diabetes and obesity, and distribution of educational materials.

Ongoing Commitment:

Over the years, campaigns have incorporated multimedia approaches, such as video messages and competitions, to engage younger audiences and medical professionals. The department has consistently collaborated with entities like the Khalifa Scientific and Research Club and the Association of Pakistani Descent Cardiologists of North America (APCNA) for lectures, workshops, and conferences.

These campaigns have reached thousands of individuals, contributing to improved community awareness and early intervention rates.

Annual Celebrations:

World Hypertension Day and World Heart Day

The department actively celebrates World Hypertension Day and World Heart Day each year, using these platforms to amplify awareness and provide practical health education.

World Hypertension Day Celebrations

Observed annually on May 17, these events emphasize hypertension as a "silent killer" and promote accurate blood pressure management. Historical activities include:

- Public awareness sessions, press conferences, and screening camps (e.g., in collaboration with PHL since at least 2009).
- In 2023, the Head of Cardiology, Prof. Dr. Qazi Abdul Saboor, delivered an enlightening video awareness message highlighting prevention strategies.

World Heart Day Celebrations

Held on September 29, these events focus on broader cardiovascular health. A prominent celebration involved:

- A quiz competition with over 25 medical student teams to educate on cardiovascular disease.
- A health awareness walk participated in by physicians and medical students.
- Poster and video competitions with more than 20 entries from students and physicians.
- Setup of risk assessment desks at four hospital locations for basic health screenings, risk evaluations, and public education.
 These events foster interdisciplinary collaboration and have been recognized by the World Heart Federation.

Highlights from Last Year (2024)

In 2024, the department's activities reached new heights, particularly in conjunction with World Hypertension Day. Aligning with global themes of accurate measurement and emergency response, the following workshops were conducted:

Workshops on Accurate Blood Pressure (BP) Measurement:

These sessions trained participants on proper techniques for checking BP, including cuff selection, positioning, and avoiding common errors. Held across multiple venues, they targeted healthcare workers, community leaders, and the general public to empower self-monitoring and reduce misdiagnosis risks.

Basic Life Support (BLS) Workshops:

Focused on emergency response to cardiac events, these hands-on sessions covered CPR, AED usage, and first-aid for hypertension-related complications. Delivered to diverse groups, including subsets of the medical fraternity (e.g., nurses, residents, and allied health professionals) and community subsets (e.g., schools, local organizations, and rural outreach programs). schools, local organizations, and rural outreach programs).

These workshops engaged over 500 participants, with follow-up surveys indicating improved knowledge and confidence in handling cardiovascular emergencies. Additional 2024 activities included a cardiology lecture series and peripheral vascular workshop in collaboration with APCNA, further enhancing academic output.




